

Landscaping Clarifications with examples

Planter/landscape bed edging guidelines:

Planter/landscape beds are those within the main lot. The following does not apply to the trees in the beauty strip/boulevard as they are not permitted to have edging. The preferred landscape bed edging is a neat four to six (4"–6") inch deep trench. Other edging, if used, shall not exceed three (3") inches above the turf height and be of a uniform type. Any other style edging must be submitted for approval.

Due to the hills and ridges, raised beds are allowed. Approved materials such as paver stone/brick etc. (not stones/rocks or boulders) are permitted as an edging if it does not exceed 3" above the turf. To clarify, the single row of stone in brick shapes (not stones or boulders) that is 3" or less, is OK around flower beds but never around trees, especially in the beauty strip. We have continued the practice to disallow edging would go around the trees in the beauty strip.
